


A Brief Look At Meghalaya's Expenditures

Vertical & horizontal devolution of 15th FC

Vertical devolution

- 41% of the net proceeds of the shareable Central taxes should be allocated to the states
- Share of Central taxes devolved for Meghalaya is 0.767%

Horizontal devolution

Horizontal devolution refers to the distribution of the devolved tax revenue among the states. The 15th Finance Commission recommended a specific formula for this horizontal devolution, based on criteria mentioned below.
